In addition, Regulation 61-43 requires an operator of a manure broker business or manure utilization area to attend CAMM training, created by Clemson University. As the owner of this permit, you are required to attend this training program by June 18, 2027, if you do not already have CAMM training certification. Expiration Dates: Manure Broker permits must be renewed every five (5) years. This permit must be renewed by June 18, 2031. The application for permit renewal must be submitted to the Department four (4) months (120 days) prior to this renewal date. If this operation is not in business for two (2) consecutive years, this permit is no longer valid and a new permit must be obtained. In accepting this permit, the owner agrees to the admission of properly authorized persons at all reasonable hours for the purpose of records inspection.

THIS IS A PERMIT FOR OPERATION OF A MANURE BROKER BUSINESS AND MAY BE REVOKED AT ANY TIME, IF THE HOLDER OF THIS PERMIT FAILS TO COMPLY WITH ANY OF THE CONDITIONS IN THE PERMIT OR APPROVED MANAGEMENT PLAN.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

(Manure Brokers)

1. Operate and maintain this waste management system in accordance with State and Federal law so as to prevent discharges to the environment. Should this waste management plan fail to function as intended, additional control or treatment of the waste may be required.
2. Operate and maintain the waste system, including all special conditions in accordance with the Waste Management Plan developed by the consultant.
3. Keep written logs and records in accordance with R.61-43.400.100 and should be made available upon request.
4. If the manure is stockpiled outside, the manure shall be stored on a concrete pad and/or other approved pad and covered with an acceptable cover to prevent odors, vectors, and runoff on a daily basis (unless otherwise stated in the permit). The cover should be properly vented with screen wire to let the gases escape. The edges of the cover should be properly anchored.
5. The Manure Balance Sheet must be submitted annually no later than June 19 of each year, to the Department:
